

**Study of the Words "Redeem", "Ransom" and Derivatives in the New Testament ("NT")**

- NOTES:** 1. This table is based on a search from Logos Bible Software ("Logos"). The term "lemma" means the basic form of a word as found in a Greek lexicon.  
 2. The source text of the NASB was searched for the Greek lemmas λυτρόω & ἐξαγοράζω - redeem; ἀπολύτρωσις & λύτρωσις - redemption; λύτρον & ἀντίλυτρον - ransom.  
 3. This search provides corresponding NASB verses, Greek lemmas and English key words. The results are 23 instances of key words in 23 NASB verses. These numbers may vary in other translations.  
 4. When the English translation varies from the prevalent meaning of the terms, one must decide if it is an accurate translation based upon the context and the term's typical meaning.  
 5. The English key words are in bold, italic & underlined and followed by the Greek lemma shown in bold brackets. Only partial verses are shown to reduce the length of the table.  
 6. The questions in the column headings should be answered based upon the context in which the words are found.
